Pledge of Allegiance

Call to order by Chairman Jeff Dorner at 7:35pm, roll call and declaration of a quorum.

1) Chairman Jeff Dorner read agenda. Motion to approve agenda was made by Paul Dalebroux, seconded by Steve LeGrave. Motion carried.

2) Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

Clerk Sarah Monfils provided the Board with minutes of the previous Town Board meeting in advance. Paul Dalebroux made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Steve LeGrave. Motion carried.

3) Reports

A) Treasurer

Ken Bouchonville read the treasurer’s report.

Paul Dalebroux made a motion to approve the treasurer’s report as presented, seconded by Steve LeGrave. Motion carried.

Ken reported that the Land CD matured on April 19th and presented options for reinvesting. There is a 6 month CD currently at 3.82% with a 3.9 apy and an 18 month 3.44% with a 3.5 apy.

Steve LeGrave made a motion to reinvest for 6 months, seconded by Paul Dalebroux. Motion carried.

B) Plan Commission

i) No meeting this month

ii) There will be 2 rezoning public hearings on May 6th. One for Hermans and one for Thiry.

C) County Supervisor

i) Steven Agamaite shared that it was the first meeting of the new board. There was a presentation about the highway shop remodel. That will move through the committees in the next few months. \$10-12 million will be the cost to remodel what they have and a few

other building fixes for 3 million rather than a new build on new land. It was not approved and the county board will vote on it in the future. It will not be a county vote.

A question was asked about the jail. Steve reported that not much has been updated in 6 months. They are making repairs on the current jail.

Steve had a few people reach out for work on Abitz Ln. that was discussed last summer.

Steve commented on the snowplowing for the year and reported that he got several calls this winter about plowing the roads on the bay for drifting. He also noticed that they often came a few days after a storm. Steve asked people to make the supervisors aware. Jeff asked for a copy of a journal that Steve kept.

Steve brought up flooding in Dyckesville and that it was discussed several years ago. Questioning if it is a town, county or state problem. Jeff said the state had said that it wasn't their problem. Steve thinks he found the point of the problem and would like to take it up to Andre Jacque, who has been responsive. Jeff suggested contacting Tammy Mallich for photos or to go look because you can see those land changes. Jeremy also suggested looking at ditches that are now blocked. He also brought up bringing in Dyckesville Sanitary District.

Steve had a homeowner call about Kinnard putting in drain tile so he called the Town's Association. The town's ditches are for the town's use not for excess water coming from the outside and tiling the fields adds to the volume of water in the ditch.

4) Public Input – 10 Minutes

Jeff made the supervisors aware that there is paperwork to file out on the town dump. They are anticipating that there will be less monitoring. There needs to be signage and he would go to Woody's sign to get that done. Paul Dalebroux made a motion to spend the amount needed to put signs around the dump as needed. Steve LeGrave seconded. Motion carried.

Jeremy has extra "Exit" signs if needed.

5) New Business

A) Purchasing Road Closed Signs

There may be a bill from the county for signs that had to be put out during high water issues. Jeff looked for prices to have our own. Steve found where he can get other pricing. Prices were compared. There was a question about high water vs. road closed. Joe also gave some pricing options from another company. Steve also suggested we take care of the "bump" signs.

Jeff Dorner made a motion to order 8 road closed signs, 8 stands and an additional 2 bump signs for an approximate \$1300. Paul Dalebroux seconded the motion. Motion carried.

B) Storm Damage

i) Abitz Lane

(1) Damaged reported and possibly funding available. The question is whether to start dealing with it or leaving it for bigger repairs. Joe Bader shared some bids but Jeff brought up that we have a bid for summer work to redo some of these roads through Scott's Construction.

(2) There was discussion about being proactive and doing something before we know if we are getting funding. Jeff mentioned that funding might be limited.

- (3) It was decided to table it to meet some guidelines. There were questions about if the ditch was blocked. The ditch needs to be cleaned regardless. Joe Bader suggested putting in breaker run for now. It was decided to put the breaker run on Abitz Ln. and strike it off with gravel.

Steve LeGrave made a motion to have Joe Bader to come in and put break run down and put gravel down to repair the shoulder and clear the ditch. Paul Dalebroux seconded. Motion carried.

- ii) Tonet Road

The banks are too high and until the water goes down we have to wait to put gravel down.

- 6) Old Business

- A) ARIP Project – Progress Report

We got our money back that we spent so far. We have to apply for more. Jeff asked the state to extend the project and it is being put in for approval to go farther down the road.

- B) Zoning Changes Update & Review

Eric Corroy sent changes to Baylake Regional Planning. It is ready to proceed with the adoption. We are going ahead with process to get the changes made.

- C) Town Road Update, Maintenance Issues

Joe Bader brought up Macco Rd and Rocky Rd washing out by the stop sign. Jeff asked Joe to take care of it. First cutting will be mid-June. Townhall Road trees should be taken care of.

Frisque Rd. The question is if we should regravell it and if there is sod to remove. Ropson Rd. grading will be another question for Cody Cravillion, as well as the culvert on County Line. Jeff will call Cody Cravillion to look at all these projects.

Approval of Scott's Construction bid for Abitz Lane and Joniaux Rd. for wedging. We are going to hold off on Joniaux. Paul Dalebroux made a motion to do the wedging on Abitz Ln. for \$23760. Steve LeGrave seconded the motion. Motion carried. Roll call vote: Jeff Dorner - Approve; Steve LeGrave – Approve; Paul Dalebroux – Approve. Motion carried.

- D) Town Clerk Update

- i) Board of Review extension filed

- ii) Hazard Mitigation Plan on USB. Jeff would like to copy it.

- iii) Election went well.

- iv) Working on financial report for mid May

- v) Recycling reports and annual licenses are being reviewed
